Lee's Place has been so fortunate in having a dedicated group of volunteers who have maintained our garden for several years. The American Academy of Matrimonial Lawyers Association awarded Lee's Place a \$10,000 grant to serve individuals and families of divorce or domestic violence. Lee's Place has been a recipient of this grant for many years and we are so grateful to this organization for it's ongoing confidence in our services. This grant enables Lee's Place to provide 58 free sessions to clients who meet the criteria.

The RoyOMartin Foundation granted \$30,000.00 to help offset the cost of providing affordable therapeutic sessions to our community. The RoyOMartin Foundation has been a generous grantor for many years.

A Client's Story of Resilience and Growth

Twenty-year-old "Jennifer" came to Lee's Place to address school stress, high anxiety around academic performance, difficulty sleeping and conflictual relationships with college roommates. During the initial intake session, it was learned that Jennifer had been in a highly volatile and abusive relationship from the ages of 16 to 19 years. This relationship included emotional manipulation, physical and sexual violence. Leaving for college was her escape from the relationship but she was unaware of how the violence had impacted her functioning in almost every arena. During the next year of consistent therapy, Jennifer built a trusting relationship with her therapist and addressed the shame she felt as well as the hypervigilance which developed as a result of the abusive relationship. Understanding the context of her perfectionism was very helpful in developing more compassion for herself as well as challenging the beliefs which contributed to a drive to be as perfect as possible. Identifying the characteristics of a healthy relationship was key to building self-confidence. She was able to evaluate friendships and romantic relationships through a new lens built on trust and safety.

Part of Jennifer's therapy was supported by a grant from the American Academy of Matrimonial Lawyers Association (AAMLF) who has supported Lee's Place for many years. Jennifer was able to afford the remainder of her therapy because of our sliding fee scale. Without grants from generous foundations such as the AAMLF and community donors, clients such as Jennifer could not afford the life changing therapy she received at Lee's Place.
